



Sergio Belardinelli was born in Sassoferrato (An) on March 5, 1952. In 1979-1980 he was fellow of the Alexander von Humboldt-Stiftung at the University of Munich, in the Geschwister Scholl Institut für politische Wissenschaft. From 1979 to 1989 he taught philosophy at the Faculty of Political Science at the University of Trieste. In 1989 he became Professor of History of Sociological Thought at the University of Bologna. At present he is Full Professor of Sociology of Culture at the Department of Political and Social Sciences at the University of Bologna, Forlì campus. He was a visiting professor at many foreign universities. Between 2002 and 2006 he was a member of the National Bioethics Committee. He has been a member of the board of directors of the Italian Institute of Germanic Studies since 2011.

His research focuses on ethical-political issues connected to the development of contemporary complex societies. He specializes in the relationship between science and society, family and society, as well as in the relationship between religion and politics, with a particular reference to bioethical contemporary challenges. He has published more than 100 articles in various academic journals and books. His books include: *La comunità liberale.
