



Elżbieta Hałas is Full Professor of Humanities and Sociology at the Institute of Sociology, University of Warsaw, Poland. Her fields of interest are: relational perspectives in social theory, theory of culture and cultural sociology, social symbolism, symbolic politics and cultural memory, symbolic interactions and social relations. Her research is focused on the problems of contemporary cultural and social transformations. She received a Fulbright Award and was a fellow of the American Council of Learned Societies (USA) and the Institute of Human Sciences (Vienna, Austria). She has served two terms on the Executive Committee of the European Sociological Association (1999–2003). She is the author of many publications in international journals, such as *Time and Society*, *Sign System Studies*, *Symbolic Interaction*, *Polish Sociological Review* as well as multiple books, including: *Life-World, Intersubjectivity and Culture: Contemporary Dilemmas* (Frankfurt am Main 2016: Peter Lang – edited book); *Przez pryzmat kultury. Dylematy badań nad współczesnością* [*Through the Prism of Culture. Dilemmas of Research on Contemporaneity*] (Warszawa 2015: Wydawnictwa Uniwersytetu Warszawskiego); *Towards the World Culture Society: Florian Znaniecki's Culturalism* (Frankfurt am Main 2010: Peter Lang); *Symbole i Społeczeństwo* [*Symbols and Society*] (Warszawa 2007: Wydawnictwa Uniwersytetu Warszawskiego). She is the founder and co-editor of the book series *Studies in Sociology: Symbols, Theory and Society* (Peter Lang). In 2016 she initiated international seminars on relational sociology in Poland. She coedited with Pierpaolo Donati the special issue of *State of Affairs / Stan Rzeczy: The Relational Turn of Sociology. Implications for the Study of Society, Culture, and Persons* (issue 12, 2017).
