



**Bogdan W. Mach** is a sociologist and political scientist, Full Professor and head of the Department of Socio-Political Systems at the Institute of Political Studies at the Polish Academy of Sciences. He is the author of books and articles on social structure, social inequalities, and their psychological and political consequences, including *Funkcja i działanie: systemowa koncepcja ruchliwości społecznej* (*Function and Action: A Systemic Concept of Social Mobility*; Warsaw 1989) and *Pokolenie historycznej nadziei i codziennego ryzyka: społeczne losy nastolatków z roku 1989* (*The Generation of Historical Hope and Daily Risk: The Socioeconomic Trajectories of People Who Were Teenagers in 1989*; Warsaw 2003), which was awarded the Stefan Nowak Prize. He is also the co-author of the volume *Social Mobility in Europe* (Oxford 2005). By combining the research paradigms of sociology, political science, and social psychology, he operates in both the field of objective social disparities (the shape and changes of social groups and networks comprising the social structure) and the field of subjective disparities (attitudes, views, values, and political behaviors). His particular areas of interest in the last decade have included transformational changes in the system of social inequality and the socioeconomic life-cycles of individuals; voting and the development of attitudes toward European integration; and attitudes on individual identity and the sense of agency.
