



Pierpaolo Donati is Alma Mater Professor of Sociology at the University of Bologna. Past President of the Italian Sociological Association, he has served as Counsellor in the Board of the International Institute of Sociology. Founder of the journal *Sociologia e Politiche Sociali*, he has directed many national and international surveys. He is known as the ‘founding father’ of the Italian ‘relational sociology’

(or ‘relational theory of society’), which was first advanced in *Introduzione alla sociologia relazionale* (Milano, 1983), expanded in *Teoria relazionale della società* (Milano, 1991), and overall developed in about 800 publications of both theoretical and empirical research.
